**MEMORANDUM OF FACTS**

**MEMORANDUM REQUESTING COURT ORDERS 'FOR SUMMONS TO  
BE GIVEN TO THE PLAINTIFF FOR SERVICE' ACCORDING TO  
ORDER V, RULE 9-A (1) OF CODE OF CIVIL PROCEDURE.**

I, Srinivas S. Devathi, plaintiff, representing myself as party-in-person in this lawsuit, an Indian citizen, state the following in the interest of equality and justice:

I attach the orders passed by this court on 31-01-2022, two pages. These orders to 'Issue summons to the defendant' must be amended suitably for the expedited issue of summons to the defendant:

- 1) I request that the Honorable court to give orders under order V rule 9-A (1) of Code of civil procedure, such that me, plaintiff, party-in-person, can service the summons to the defendant, by sending summons through India post speed post / air-mail delivery where applicable. The defendant is situate in New Delhi, India.
- 2) The orders when stated "summons to be issued by party-in-person / plaintiff by hand", will provide necessary clarity to pending branch and they would hand off all responsibility of serving summons to defendant to me. I shall pay the court process fee if I am ordered to.



To address the remarks / words in the court order dated 31-01-2022, I will be submitting the following two 'Memoranda'.

- a) Memorandum to address the phrase 'Maintainability of suit', by production of additional documents to address maintainability of OS 2487 of 2021 and hence this lawsuit, and pin-pointing the fraud of USPTO to the Honorable court.
- b) Memorandum with my 'LEGAL remarks' to address any 'Illegal attempts', 'Fraudulent attempts', 'abuse of CPC order XXXII rules 1 to 14', all of which constitutes 'Treason against India' when committed by an Indian citizen / company / organization / government / court.
