MEMORANDUM UNDER ORDER VI, RULE 17 OF CPC

I submit the following memorandum for 'Amendments of Pleadings', seeking 'Immediate interim relief' from the Honorable Court, for few prayer points, along with the reasons giving the 'legal urgency' for the relief sought through these interim orders.

I pray the Honorable High Court of Karnataka to issue immediate interim relief orders to

1. Respondent to issue the 'Consent letter of Indian Central Government duly certified by secretary to Indian Central Government, to sue united states patent and trademark office uspto, and summon WIPO - World Intellectual Property Organization, International Bureau to assist the court with discovery and fact finding', as formally requested in my communication to respondent in annexure U, to address CPC section 86(1) applicable to them, and initiate the proceeding in the trial court, at the earliest. This is in accordance with documented proof submitted and explained in annexure C, of Breach of Patent Cooperation Treaty articles 18(2) and 19(1), committed by uspto on 5-8-2015, in their capacity of ISA - International Search Authority for **PCT** my international application PCT/US2014/046619 which corresponds to my invention priority worldwide liebility coursed patent grant US 8,910,998 B1'.

LEGAL URGENCY explained for the sought interim relief. Uspto breached Patent Cooperation Treaty on 5-8-2015. The Honorable High Court of Karnataka having recognized the Breach of Patent cooperation Treaty committed by uspto, issue orders dated 6-2-2023 to the respondent, attached as annexure D, to issue the consent letter after scheduling a hearing within six weeks from the date of orders. On 13-2-2023, respondent along with participants from AMS division conduct a 'webex meeting' with me. I detailed the facts of Breach of Patent cooperation Treaty', and asked the team twice if they had any questions that I could address. There were no questions, clearly indicating they are fully appraised about the 'Breach of PCT committed by uspto'. And I am yet to receive the 'Consent letter' according to the issued orders. There is IMMEDIATE LEGAL URGENCY TO INITIATE THE TRIAL COURT PROCEEDING AGAINST USPTO.

2. This immediate interim relief corresponds to prayer point F of the writ petition. Respondent to work with Finance Ministry and issue me a Goods and Services Tax, GST number without me having to submit Aadhar card, which needs me to give my finger prints and bio-metric information.

LEGAL URGENCY explained for the sought interim relief. The worldwide liability owed to me by uspto by a conservative estimate is set at 93 Trillion Earthlings / \$. Other countries and Indian Government might come at higher numbers within the estimation table given in annexure J. By way of annexure F and the indicated wealth distribution in annexure G, I am legally a 55:45 wealth partner with Indian Government and Union of India. Given the wealth I am about to bring to India, manage it across banks and trusts, with 45% of it shared with Indian Government / Union of India, I want the Union of India, represented by respondent, to communicate with Finance Ministry, and have them make an exception and issue me a GST number without me having to submit my Aadhar card, which in turn requires me to give my finger prints. I need the GST number to execute a legal agreement with a tenant to my property, which will keep income coming in for me, which will take care of my 'Living Expenses'. I have 56 lakhs of market debt and need this income source to pay off the debt and for my living expenses. The execution of the legal agreement is held up for lack of GST number with me. Hence, I need these orders issued to the respondent, at the earliest.

3. This immediate interim relief corresponds to prayer point Q of the writ petition. Respondent to work with Defense Ministry, and appoint a twelve member all Hindu Indian military unit, to provide security and ensure my 'physical safety and security', in a non-intrusive way, covering both locations 1 and 2 mentioned in annexure T, until all the 62 sale agreements listed in annexure K and described in annexure L are executed, according to the Honorable court orders. Respondent to introduce the appointed twelve member military unit to me.

LEGAL URGENCY explained for the sought interim relief. I am the inventor to patent US 8,910,998 B1, and the 'Seller' who would execute the 62 sale agreements, one each with each of the 62 countries, and bring the full wealth of at least 93 Trillion Earthlings / \$ into India, and further distribute the wealth within India according to annexures F and G. With the Honorable courts attention to this writ petition, these 62 sale agreements could be

executed within this year and next. My physical safety is of great importance to myself and India. Hence, I need these orders issued to the respondent at the earliest.

All the other 'Prayer points' filed with the Writ petition A, B, C, D, E, G, H, I, J, K, L, M, N, O, P, R, S, T, U, V, W, X, Y, Z, AA, BB, CC, DD, EE, FF, GG, HH, II, JJ, KK, and LL remain the same and the Honorable court can issue orders after respondent participates and provide their response.

Among these other 'Prayer points', there is also legal urgency in receiving the Honorable courts orders directed to the respondent where applicable, for the 'Prayer points' L, To appoint a special court, and 'Prayer points' W to II, Investigation to be conducted by Ministry of Law and Justice. In this context, the Prayer point L, a special court appointed will allow continuous proceeding, with no interruptions of any kind, and will allow expedited pursuit of Justice for me and Union of India.
